




Messy Church: March 26th - Report by Joan Cape



We finished our series on the women in Jesus' lineage by looking at his mother, Mary. The Bible doesn't tell us much about her. And yet, she was so important, chosen by God to be the mother of his son.



Next up was the time when Mary and Joseph "lost" Jesus in the temple in Jerusalem: Mary saw clearly that this son of hers was really not any ordinary boy! Our "can you find Jesus?" bottles were a good way of talking about who Jesus is and what he means to us. as we hid

and then searched for in among the barley grains a jelly baby Jesus, a little silver cross, gold sequins representing the gifts he gives us, hearts to signify his love....and more besides.





Then came the first miracle: when the wine ran out at the wedding and Mary told Jesus to sort things out, we have no idea what she really expected...the miraculous turning of the water into wine was probably quite a shock!"

Mary's life was in many ways like anybody else's: a scrappy mix of ups and downs. Making things from scraps of foam,, we thought about the funny mix our own lives are.



She had a lot of sad times – we made a mobile to help us think of our sad times, and our worries: a kind of reminder to take these things to God in prayer. The end of the story came all too soon: Jesus died on the cross and was laid to rest in the tomb. But was it the end?? Our edible creation of the tomb with the stone rolled away from the mouth let us talk about what happened that first Easter – and how Mary might have felt.

And finally we had fun decorating some large crosses. The cross is often seen as a symbol of something sad – but in fact the empty cross is rather a symbol of joy, of hope for the future, and the children had great fun giving life and colour to our plain crosses. Jesus died for us, he rose again – and that is **GOOD NEWS.**

Happy Easter to you all , when it comes, from all of us at Messy Church.
