

This tiny island nation is only two thirds the size of the Isle of Wight. However, the surrounding sea,


the island's exclusive economic zone, is seven times larger than that of New Zealand.

Music Worship Leading

Included in this month's mailing is a job description for a Music Worship Leader. It's been through a process of discussion and revision by the kirk session.

Why are we are sending this out to you all?

- . It's not an attempt to replace our current system of music worship. I think most of us are quite happy with that.
- It's not a bid to stop initiatives coming from within the congregation to involve more people in leading worship, including our young people. On the contrary, we want to encourage them.
- . It's a possible way to develop further the music used in our worship. As a kirk session, we won't be upset if it doesn't result in anything.

What will I find in looking at this?

- You'll find a quite broad job description, not related to any one musical instrument. That's deliberately not to exclude anyone who has a God-given talent for leading people in the musical worship of God.
- You'll also find that we consider it vital that the person should be a practising Christian and, if appointed, should be regularly involved in the life of Trinity Community Church.
- In addition, you'll find quite a lot of detailed information, some of which we are including for legal reasons



Please read over the job description and pray about it. Please feel free to comment or ask questions.

If you're thinking that you might potentially be that person, or are unsure about it, you would be very welcome to ask further questions in confidence, without committing yourself. Please speak to John or Neil.

The same goes if you have alternative ideas. We're simply trying to encourage people to use their God-given gifts and musical skills in our worship.

Prayer Breakfast - 1 March

On Saturday 1st March we held our first Prayer Breakfast to pray for all our Penicuik children and young people. Around 30 people from across the churches attended, which was hugely encouraging.

We started with a continental style breakfast of fruit juices, cereals, pastries, muffins, wonderful fresh bread from Lidl!, & beautiful fruit displays brought by Mary and her daughters Holly & Lucy, along

with teas & coffees. The meeting began with worship led by Andrew, Caroline & Phoebe before we then moved into a time of prayer around different tables, covering the Penicuik schools, Youth Alpha, TYBG, PNK Young Kirk (who had made a prayer tree to bring along), Kidspace, Messy Church, Holiday Club, St James' childrens' work and uniformed organisations. Each of these had up to date information on prayer needs/requests, allowing people to specifically focus their prayers on these issues.

Our next prayer breakfast will be on Saturday 3rd May and will take the same format. Everyone is most welcome to come along to this to continue to pray for the children's and young peoples' work. There is no pressure to join in group prayer if you'd rather not, we'd just love to have you there to support this if you have an interest in this, so people can either pray on their own or in a group, whatever their preference is.

> From the questionnaires, we also asked if anyone had ideas on what we could do as a group in a wider context, so two of the boys (Benjamin & Adam) are going to help with hospitality at our next prayer breakfast on 3rd May, making pancakes & hot chocolate for everyone! They also felt it would be good to support a charity and we've chosen World Extreme Medicine Trust, which Benjamin is very involved with, so we'll have a donation box for that on the day too, if

Bethany Christian Trust 3 March

The speaker from Bethany Christian Trust was Rachael Gilfillan who has had several different roles with Bethany including working in their charity shops, in the finance department and now as a

fundraiser.



The charity was founded in 1983 by pastor Alan and Anne Berry in response to the poverty and homelessness they witnessed in their local area of Leith. The vision is to end homelessness in Scotland one person at a time, one family at a time and one community at a time.

The causes of homelessness are many including mental illness, employment issues, financial, relationship

breakdown and drug/alcohol problems. There are three areas of support to tackle the causes and consequences of homelessness beginning with Homelessness Prevention teams and community development workers running drop ins and recovery programmes. Crisis Intervention teams are there for people in urgent need of temporary accommodation. They also run the Care vans providing food and drinks. The Housing and Support teams provide tenancies around Scotland for vulnerable people in need and also offer support.

Bethany have around 30 services and projects throughout Scotland supporting over 7,000 people. Rachael had brought some leaflets, pens and prayer diaries for us to take away. She finished with a prayer.

Sure Foundations - 17 March

On Monday 17th March the Guild met for the final meeting of the session. The theme for this year has been Sure Foundations.



Agnes Haggart the convener opened the meeting by reflecting on a recent meeting of Lothian Guild Together which she had attended. In her address the current Moderator of Lothian and Borders presbytery, Lorna Souter reminded those present of the need to build their lives on the Sure Foundation of the Lord Jesus Christ and that the famous tea making and baking skills of the Women's Guild can be used to grow the Church.



Recently on Heart of the Matter, Karen Gillon National Secretary of the Guild talked about how God had used everything in her past life from Scripture Union Camps to youth work and politics to prepare her for her present role.

She guoted Jeremiah 29 I alone know the plans I have for you. Plans to bring prosperity and not disaster, plans to bring about the future you hope for. She reminded the listeners that the Guild were not only tea makers but women who because the guild projects were


knowledgeable about many difficult subjects and had raised a lot of money to support them.

Agnes went on to say that although reluctant to take on the role of convener she had enjoyed her first year in office. It had been a steep learning curve but the solid foundation of family, Sunday School, Scripture Union and previous life experience had prepared her for the job.

She reported that Trinity Guild currently has 35 members and a further 5 visitors. The average attendance at each meeting being 25. The session had started with a Beetle Drive and was followed by a variety of challenging and interesting speakers.

Finally Agnes thanked the committee for their support and the members for their commitment. She encouraged everyone to look forward to the next session. starting in September, when the theme will be Living Stones.

A pizza/games night planned for 1st April, to which some of the Gorebridge youth leaders will be joining us to lead the games, but also to talk to our youth group about the wider youth picture in Midlothian. They also provided details about the summer Stage & Slam event, and encouraging our group in their ongoing faith journey.

At our session on 18th March, we gave out questionnaires to our young people asking them what they'd prefer to do in the April - June session, and pretty much everyone requested some form of Bible study alongside the hospitality side of things, as we've been doing for some time now. We'll therefore move the group back to our house as this period will be exam season and not all of the young people will be able to come each week, as will be prioritising studying for exams.
