Audio Visual improvements

Audio Visual (AV) covers the technology that provides projected images, song videos, song words, the ministers sermon illustration slides, sound system for both songs, videos, and presenters microphones. Your team has introduced several improvements in the main church that you may have spotted.

The introduction of songs from iSing Worship has brought a new look and sound to our praise.



Vicky Nicolson brought the technology from Penicuik South Church to Trinity Community and we have integrated the system into the existing AV system.

iSing brings a wide selection of songs which can be played with or without musical backing or vocals. Songs can be adjusted for number of verses, and a range of backgrounds make the large text easier to see.

A new large widescreen monitor screen on the gallery facing the communion table displays what is being projected to the congregation, enabling the presenter to see what is being projected behind them, without the need to constantly keep turning round to see what you see as a congregation.



We have also added a slide changer remote control for the presenter so they can advance, or retard, the projected slide to align with their talk.



presenter is saying by converting speech to text in real time. Neil Cape has done the work on this piece of wizardry.

Easter Holy Week commenced with Palm Sunday, which was a joint service with Penicuik north Kirk in our church. Rev Graham Astles preached for us, including the Growing Young theme in his address.

Resurrection Sunday is a day of rejoicing, celebrating the risen Christ.

We started at 6.00am in the morning with our annual sunrise service at Broomhill. Over a dozen souls gathered at a chilly but dry St. James

re trekking up the hill in the dark. A short service was led by Rev Nick Bowry, with prayer, songs, and bible readings.

We witnessed the sun rise, yes the clouds did break for us to see the sun appear over the horizon. You can count the number of times we actually see the sun on one hand. It is more usually heavy cloud cover over Penicuik at dawn on resurrection Sunday. A hearty breakfast was provided at St. James which was much welcomed to warm our chilly hands.

Beyond Easter Report by Jim Paterson

The theme for the Sunday after Easter, was 'Put back together' from John 21.



This related the story of Jesus appearing before the disciples fishing but catching nothing, and Peter realising it was the Lord on the shore.



Having told them how to catch their fish Jesus cooked breakfast and spoke to Peter, asking him three time if Peter loved Him. For this service our minister John took the ole of Peter, speaking in the first person, a nonologue. This brought a different perspective to the story, telling it through the eyes of Peter.

Our service on Sunday 23rd theme was The Emmaus Incident (Luke 24: 13-35), relating the story of Jesus meeting with two travellers to Emmaus, seven miles from Jerusalem.



John Urquhart once again addressed us in the first person, taking the role of Cleopas, one of the travellers. Cleopas eventually realises who the new person joining them is as they break bread at their evening meal together, only for Jesus to disappear.

Sermons are more usually delivered in the third person, and it takes considerable effort to relate a bible story in first person, but the impact is more personal, as if you were there taking part. I hope that John will use this technique on occasion for some future sermons.
