All age gatherings celebrate Resurrection Sunday

Members of the Penicuik Churches Together and beyond met on Easter Sunday 20th April to celebrate the Risen Christ.

The first gathering was before dawn at St. James the Less where some 20 plus early risers of all ages gathered to walk to the top of Broomhill. The Rev Nick Bowry led us as we turned to face east toward the rising sun. Although we were silent we could hear the birds already singing signalling the coming of a new day. Though the earth was cold signs of new life and growth surrounded us.

Nick opened with 1 Corinthians 15:20, Christ has been raised from the dead, as the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. We sang Thine be the glory as our opening hymn, followed by a

reading from Luke 24 Jesus has Risen. At 5.55am the sun was rising in the east, piercing the light cloud cover of the night, proclaiming the start of a new day. Prayers and praise, included 'Jesus Light of the world shine upon us'.

We descended Broomhill back to St. James the Less for a welcome breakfast with hot drinks, filled rolls Croissants.

At 11am many of us met again at **Trinity Community church** All Age service with Joan Cape leading. Three of our hymns were led by the praise musicians Andrew Dunsire on guitar, Holly Hadwen vocals, and Caroline Toms guitar and vocals. The service included accounts of the Resurrection from the Roman soldier, played by Neil Cape, John the disciple, played by Bill Webster and the friend Mary Magdalene, played by Christine Jackson. Some of the younger children handed out small Easter eggs to the congregation as they left the service at the end.

Both these services included people of all ages. The Trinity Community services address the very young who learn about God and Jesus through our Kidspace activities time on a Sunday morning, with the all age bringing the gospel to young people, mums and dads, grandparents and elderly worshippers. Featuring a range of hymns and songs, some introduced by the people who chose them, telling us why they are special to them.




The Rev Graham Astles, Nick Bowry and Tom McEvoy will lead the event.

Palm Sunday





Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where he was greeted by crowds waving palm branches and shouting "Hosanna". This event marks the beginning of Holy Week and is a time for reflecting on both the joy of Jesus's arrival and the subsequent suffering he would endure. John's reflections time took us from the Passover to the last supper, which we celebrate during holy communion,

commemorating the Lord's death taking of a small piece of bread and sip of wine. We are following a commandment given by Jesus, that His followers take in remembrance of Him.

Holy Week Monday

We continued the Passover story with John's gospel chapter 11 & 12. We hear how the temple chief priests and the Pharisees had given orders that anyone who knew where Jesus was should report it, so that they could arrest him. However six days before Passover Jesus visited the house of Lazarus, whom Jesus had raised from the dead, and was served a meal. Mary bathed the feet of Jesus in expensive aromatic oil, drying them with her hair. Judas, he who would later betray Jesus, attempted to make capital from the situation criticising the loss of revenue for this oil, which could have been given to the poor! The chief priests on hearing of Jesus and Lazarus planned on killing them both, as many of the Jewish people were beginning to believe in Jesus.

The evening service covered the final stage before Jesus is taken to the cross. Reading from Matthew 26. When Jesus goes to pray in the garden of Gethsemane, accompanied by Peter and the two sons of Zebedee. Later Jesus chastises the disciples when he finds them asleep, not once but three times. After Judas betrayed Jesus who was then arrested we heard how Peter followed, but on questioning denied any knowledge of Jesus, not once but three times. When a cock crowed Peter recalled that Jesus prophesied that Peter would deny him, and he wept bitterly. Our final reading from John 19 followed Jesus carrying his own cross to Calvary, his crucifixion, death and removal from the cross to a nearby empty tomb. John's reflections took the words of Thabiti Anyabwile in Christianity Today; "He committed no sins" and "By his wounds you have been healed" (1Peter 2: 22-24).
