# Messy Church Update from Joan Cape

Some of you will be wondering what's happening with Messy Church - normally by this time we'd have had at least one session after the school holidays and be advertising the next one.

The last couple of years have not been entirely straightforward: after Covid. it was a real struggle to get things going again. Some families just did not want to engage with anything involving lots of people they didn't know very well, some had found different activities for their youngsters, and of course family circumstances had changed in the course of the long break in being able to hold "live" sessions.

One or two had moved away, and all were a good bit older, with changed interests and friendship groups. And the sense of commitment seemed to have become much

The number on our register was on the surface quite healthy - however the reality From inception 2010 to pandemic; has been that very few families ever got back into a rhythm of coming every (or almost every) month. This last year saw us with three families coming almost every time, augmented in a fairly random way by

80-100 per month

whoever wasn't doing anything else! Indeed since Christmas we have rarely got to double figures.

Our team of helpers have been very faithful over the years, and throughout this rather lean time.

We're all getting older – several of us have been involved in one way or another since 2010. when we first rather tentatively started Penicuik's Messy Church – initially meeting every two months or so in the then South Church Hall in West Street, under the leadership of Katrina McDonald and Lynne Turnbull, assisted by Sheila Anderson, Joan Cape and a number of others. After a couple of years we moved to what was then St Mungo's Hall, where we continue to meet. In those early days we often had numbers around 80, on one notable occasion feeding over 100 with a full Christmas dinner!

# **Looking to the Future**

Times have changed and we need to have a rethink. The rough plan (yet to be fleshed out) is that we will for this year not have a monthly session but instead meet perhaps 4 times in the school year: probably around harvest or Halloween, then Christmas, Easter, and something towards the start of the summer holidays.



With good advertising and personal contacts we hope to build a new family of people who will look forward to coming and even want us to do something more

And if this happens, we may well be looking for some new helpers of all ages.

We want to thank from the bottom of our hearts those who have supported us with prayer, money and other contributions, those who have collected "junk" as and when requested, and those who have just

encouraged us by showing an interest...that's probably most of the congregation!

We ask you to keep us in your prayers, as we seek to find how and if God wants us to continue. And if the message becomes clear that we should stop at the end of this next school year, we will be looking for His guidance (and your ideas) as to what we should do instead to reach out to local families in a way which can build a sense of community through times of fun built on God's word.

Finally: watch this space for news of the next session, sometime in October!

The questions were created by question master Gordon MacDonald, who provided the six questions for each category, with Margaret Black keeping the scores.




